The theme is **Minerals, Mines & Collectors**, - giving the guest speakers copious leeway to expand on almost any subject that they are passionate about. We hope to publish a list of the guest speakers and their pet subjects early in 2009. The seminar venue is the Theatrette of the Queensland Museum, located at Southbank - an easy 10 minute walk from the Brisbane CBD.
