Joint Mineralogical Societies of Australasia 34th Annual Seminar

The next Joint Mineralogical Societies of Australasia 34th Annual Seminar will be held in Melbourne 11th to 13th June 2011, at Gemmology House 380-382 Spencer Street, West Melbourne. The theme will be "Mineralogy into the future".

We (Western Australia) are putting a proposal to hold the seminar in Perth in 2012 with a theme of "Rare Earth Minerals". This proposal will be put to the meeting of the joint societies at the annual seminar in Melbourne.

Report from Club President - Stewart Cole

Allan Hart is attending the 34thAnnual Seminar of the Joint Mineralogical Societies of Australasia being held in Melbourne June 11,12 & 13. He will be making representations of behalf on MINSOCWA to host the 2012 Joint Societies Seminar. On rotation the next meeting should be held in Perth as the last joint meeting in WA was in 2005. Your committee has put in a lot of preparation for the seminar to increase the chances that MINSOCWA will be formally granted the next Joint Societies Seminar. Our selected topic would be Rare Earth Minerals. REMs

A lot of "proper prior planning" has been taking place to ensure our offer to host the 2012 Seminar will be successful. Logistics for hosting the seminar include:- best date to hold seminar especially for Eastern states visitors; venue; public transport to and from venue, accommodation, topic, speakers, dinner, field trip. Members will be asked to volunteer to take responsibility for sub-committees to organise the different aspects of the seminar. I will talk further about the sub-committees at our June meeting. I have been asked what elements are considered the "rare earth elements". I and your committee propose the definition is the elements, scandium, yttrium, and the fifteen lanthanides which are elements 57-71 (Lanthanum, Cerium, Praseodymium, Neodymium, Promethium, Samarium, Europium, Gadolinium, Terbium, Dysprosium, Holmium, Erbium, Thulium, Ytterbiumm, Lutetium). In addition REMs are a fairly specific topic inside the mineralogy world, I know I don't collect these minerals and I'm suspecting not many of us do, but they are currently very topical with news reports and articles in the press every day. There have been three seminars, I know of this year specifically related to rare earths with more scheduled for 2012. So I am proposing a challenge to the membership. This will take the form of a "lucky dip". Members will draw "out of a hat" an element. You will be asked to give a short talk (5 to 10 minutes duration) at another meeting. Presentation assistance will be available. Our December meeting has a new format of "short" presentations by members. You may choose to give your REM's talk in December.

The REMs topic will be based on a mineral or minerals that have that element in its composition. For our talks we can forget about Promethium as it doesn't occur in any quantity naturally. Allan Hart has samples of the Rare earth elements and he has agreed to do a show and tell. This exercise will allow all of us a greater depth of knowledge in the REM suite of minerals.

So a tit-bit of information to brighten a dry message. A pyrophoric mixed rare-earth alloy called Mischmetall (50% Ce, 25% La, 25% other light lanthanides) or misch


Re Thoughts on mislabelled mineral specimens by Allan Hart
