General Meeting, Wednesday. November 14, 2018

Following the meeting Jason Bennett presented a talk on "Teasing apart the cassiterite multi-tool".

In 2011, Jason completed an Honours Thesis in experimental petrology examining the effects of Ni and Cu on the Sulfur Content at Sulfide Saturation of Basaltic Magmas at the Research School of Earth Sciences (ANU). In 2012 he moved to Perth to join the BHP Billiton Graduate Program, where he worked in both exploration and mine geology roles in Iron Ore in the Pilbara. In 2015, Jason joined the Centre for Exploration Targeting at UWA to start a PhD on the use of cassiterite as a multiprocess recorder of Sn-bearing mineral systems. Jason has been a member of the Mineralogical Society of Western Australia since coming to Perth in 2012.

Cassiterite (SnO₂) is ubiquitous in many mineralising systems related to highly fractionated reduced granitic magmas, including the metals W, Mo, Li, Nb, Ta and In which are deemed 'Critical Metals' for 21st Century technology. In order to find more exploitable deposits for these resources, we need to develop more detailed and nuanced models that can describe how and why the existing known deposits are where they are. As cassiterite is a direct product of the mineralising event in many cases, changes in the chemical and isotopic signatures recorded during growth might be of use to develop a sort of 'timeline of events' during the formation of the deposit. In this talk, I will present a summary of some of the work I have done during my PhD thesis, a few key findings, and where I hope to take this research in the future.

Jason is currently completing his PhD and the data he presented has not yet been published so further details are unavailable. We look forward to reading more on this topic in the future.

Upcoming Meetings and Activity Days

Special general meeting and ordinary general Meeting, Wednesday. January 9, 2019

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 9th January 2019 at 7:30 PM on the premises of the WA Lapidary and Rockhunting Club at 31 Gladstone Road, Rivervale, WA. . Dr. Des Lascelles will be presenting a talk of "Fibrous minerals and the genesis of asbestos and tiger eye". This talk will follow a special general meeting to vote on acceptance of the new draft constitution and an ordinary general meeting.

Talk Abstract:

About the talk: A brief description of what makes a fibrous mineral and their occurrence, followed by a discussion on asbestiform minerals and their genesis and the origin of tiger eye gemstones.

About the speaker: Des graduated from London University with BSc Hons in 1964 and spent 5 yrs with De Beers Group in West Africa and then Australia before enrolling at Macquarie University to do research into the weathering of ultramafic rocks and graduated with MSc in 1973. Des then worked at the Paraburdoo Iron ore Mine before moving to far north Queensland and commencing as an independent consultant geologist in a wide variety of fields but mostly in iron ore. Des retired from full time employment in 1998 and enrolled part-time at UWA to do research on BIF and iron ore leading to a PhD. Des's thesis consisted of 7 sole author published papers on BIF and iron ore and he was appointed an Adjunct Research Fellow at the Centre for Exploration Targeting at UWA. Des has been fully retired as a consultant since 2013 but continues to write research and review papers from home.
